

The Student Support Fund

Princess Sumaya University for Technology offers a number of forms of financial assistance to University students facing financial difficulties that may prevent them from continuing their university career.

The Student Support Fund receives and reviews applications from students requesting financial assistance, applying the appropriate set of criteria to determine the student's eligibility for financial assistance.

Decisions also depend on the availability of adequate financial resources to provide financial assistance to students. The University allocates part of its budget to contribute to the Student Support Fund budget, and also accepts contributions from individuals and institutions that wish to assist in supporting students in their academic careers.

Student Support Fund and Financial Aid:

The Fund is in place to increase the opportunities presented to undergraduate students who wish to

continue their university education but find they have financial difficulties preventing them from achieving their educational goals. PSUT provides this quality service in order to attract students to enroll at the University.

Conditions for obtaining financial assistance:

- A student receiving a grant in accordance with these regulations should meet the following conditions:
 - a. His/her financial situation should be such that he is unable to pay the University fees.
 - b. He/she should be a regular, full-time student at the University.
 - c. No disciplinary procedures should have been brought against him/her, from a warning and above, for the two semesters preceding the semester in which he is applying for a grant. The summer semester is not considered a study semester in this regard.
 - d. His/her cumulative average in any one semester should be no less than 68%, and the summer semester is not considered a study semester in this regard.

- e. New students are exempt from conditions (c) and (d).
- f. In the case of a new student, the High School average or equivalent should be no less than 80%.
 - If the student's grant is stopped as a result of his / her cumulative average dropping below 68%, he/she may reapply for a grant in the semester following that in which the required average is achieved.

Please be aware of the following important points:

- Submission of an application by a student does not necessarily mean that the application will be approved, and the student will be informed after a decision has been reached by the Student Support Fund Committee.
- Financial assistance is only available for the maximum period permitted to meet graduation requirements (completion of the study plan) in the program for which the student is registered.
- The period for which student support is paid includes the Summer Semester, even if the student is not registered for any courses during the summer.

The required documents to apply for a grant from the Student Support Fund:

- A certified copy of the Family Notebook.
- A document showing the combined income of all family members.
- A bank statement showing all family accounts for the period of one year.
- A document showing the parents' salary from the Social Security Corporation.
- A document showing the parents' salary from the Retirement and Compensations Directorate.
- A certificate from the Department of Land and Surveys showing any immovable property belonging to the parents and the student.

Reasons for suspension of financial aid payments:

- a. If the student's grant is withdrawn as a result of his/her cumulative average falling below 68%, he/she may apply to have the grant reinstated in the semester following that in which the required average is achieved.

- b. The issuance of any disciplinary procedure, from a warning and above, against the student during the period in which he/she is receiving financial aid will result in suspension of payment. The summer semester is not considered a study semester in this regard.
- c. Financial aid does not cover any repeated courses or those taken by the receiving student from outside his/her academic plan; therefore, the student must bear the cost of these credit hours.

When to apply for financial aid:

- The First Semester of the academic year
- The Second Semester of the academic year
