

Joint Programs run between
Princess Sumaya University for Technology and
Oakland University (USA)

Princess Sumaya University for Technology (PSUT) announces that applications are now being accepted for joint study programs with Oakland University (OU) in the United States. The details are as follows:

One: King Abdullah II School of Engineering / Computer Engineering 3 + 2 (dual-degree)

The academic degree: The student studies the equivalent of (98) credit hours (approximately three academic years) at PSUT, going on to complete the remaining semesters (an average of 72 credit hours, or two academic years) at OU, thus becoming eligible for two Bachelor degrees in Computer Engineering, one from each university. There will be an opportunity for students to enroll in the Oakland University Master's program and have some of the courses taken accredited, thus reducing the period of study to less than two years.

Stages of the Program:-

Stage 1: The student will study 98 credit hours at PSUT, in accordance with the University's rules and regulations.

Stage 2: The student goes on to study 72 credit hours at OU according to their rules and regulations. The course of study leads to the student obtaining two Bachelor's degrees (one from PSUT and one from UMD).

Note: Obtaining the above-mentioned degrees requires the fulfillment of the study plan and meeting the specified conditions.

Requirements for obtaining the degrees:

1. Complete the program requirements during the first three years by studying (98) credit hours at PSUT according to the attached study plan, achieving a minimum average of 70%.
2. Complete the program requirements during the following two years (an average of 72 credit hours) at OU according to the attached study plan, achieving a minimum GPA of 3.0.

Admission requirements:

1. The student is accepted to study the Computer Engineering major at PSUT upon meeting the University's admission requirements. He/she studies 98 credit hours at PSUT with a **minimum** acceptable cumulative average of 70%.

2. In order for the student to submit his/her application, upon completion of the conditions stipulated in clause (1) for admission to OU, the student must obtain an English language proficiency certificate based on one of the following tests and scores:

a) If the student scores 79 in TOEFL, or 6.5 in IELTS, he / she can begin studying the specialization courses.

b) If the student scores 69-78 in TOEFL, or between 6-6.5 in IELTS, the student must study ESL in the first semester of his/her study and will continue to study these courses until he/she obtains the English Proficiency Certificate, in addition to studying specialization courses.

c) If the student scores less than 69 in TOEFL, or less than 6 in IELTS, the student should study ESL in the first semester of his/her study. He/she shall continue to study these courses until they are completed and then he/she shall commence studying the specialization courses.

d) Note that ESL courses are not a requirement of the study plan in the specialization.

3. Upon completion of the required credit hours to be studied at OU, as specified in the Appendix, the student is granted a Bachelor's degree in Computer Engineering from PSUT after requesting a transcript from OU and submitting it to the Deanship of Admissions and Registration at PSUT. The student is also granted a Bachelor's degree in Computer Engineering from OU, and thus obtains two degrees from two universities.

Tuition fees:

1. The student shall pay the tuition fees at PSUT for the courses and credit hours which he/she studies there.

2. The same tuition fees that are paid by American students from the State of Michigan (in-state) apply to PSUT students, and are payable to OU.

3. PSUT shall charge the student an annual fee of 750 JOD (seven hundred and fifty dinars) for each year spent by the student at UMD in lieu of admission and registration services, follow-up and course equivalency procedures.

4. The cost of participating in OU's health insurance plan is approximately \$ 2,000.

5. OU will help students to secure a place in university accommodation.

6. The student shall bear all other expenses such as accommodation, travel, and visa.

Note: There are no financial charges for enrolling at OU and the student pays no quarterly fees.

Scholarships: PSUT students admitted to OU receive a scholarship of 43% of the international student tuition fees at Oakland University. Current tuition fees can be viewed on the university's website:

Approximate cost of study at OU: -

- Price per credit hour for PSUT students taking BSc program, after discount: Approximately \$ 504 (\$ 853 before discount).
- Price per credit hour for PSUT students taking Master's program, after discount: Approximately \$ 680 (\$ 1,000 before discount).
- Average cost of living per semester (including housing and food): Approximately \$ 13,000.
- The cost of study materials per semester: Approximately \$ 2,000.
- The cost of health insurance per semester: approximately \$ 2,000.
- There are no quarterly fees.

Withdrawal from study at OU:-

1. A student who wishes to withdraw from his/her studies at OU for any reason may return to PSUT to complete his/her studies. The courses he/she studied at OU will be accredited to the study plan at PSUT.

2. If the student commits any behavior that violates OU rules and regulations, he/she will be subject to the penalty of removal from the program. PSUT will assess the student's status to reach decision whether or not he/she should be permitted to continue studying at PSUT.

Regulations and Laws: Students studying at OU are obliged to abide by Michigan State Residency Laws and OU rules and regulations. Students are held fully responsible according to the law.

Entry visa to the USA: PSUT bears no responsibility for guaranteeing the student a visa to the United States. Visa requirements are as follows:

- An acceptance letter from Oakland University (PSUT will help the student to obtain it).
- Get an I-20, the form for international students, in order to obtain an F-1 visa.
- Follow the instructions to obtain a visa.

Two: King Abdullah School of Engineering

The Joint Program between Princess Sumaya University for Technology (PSUT) and Oakland University (OU) in Engineering disciplines includes:

The academic degree: The student studies for one year (12 months) at OU. He/she may then apply for graduate studies in Engineering disciplines at OU, whereby the equivalent of (12) credit hours from this first year will be accredited towards postgraduate studies (Master's and Doctorate) at OU, providing the student is accepted and completes the course of study.

Stages of the Program:-

Stage one: The student studies the first four years of the undergraduate program at PSUT, according to the rules and regulations of the University.

Stage two: The student goes on to study the final year at OU according to the rules and regulations of that university. The courses completed by the student are accredited by PSUT before traveling, thus the student is eligible to obtain an undergraduate degree from PSUT.

Stage three: If the student is accepted to the postgraduate program at Oakland University, 12 credit hours from those studied during the first year there will be accredited. This makes it possible to reduce the study period for the graduate program to which the student is accepted by approximately one year, which leads to the student obtaining a Master's degree from OU.

Note: Obtaining the above-mentioned degrees requires the fulfillment of the study plan and meeting the specified conditions. Each student should check with his / her liaison officer to determine which courses to take at OU.

Entry requirements:

Students at the Bachelor's level and postgraduate students (Master's and PhD) can apply to study at OU for a period of one year (12 months).

1. The student must first be accepted to study an Engineering discipline at PSUT after meeting the University entry requirements. His/her cumulative average for these courses should be no less than 75%.
2. After fulfilling the conditions stipulated in the preceding clause (1), which includes obtaining the English Proficiency Certificate, the student may apply for admission to OU. If the student achieves a score of 79 in TOEFL, or 6.5 in IELTS, he / she can commence studying the specialization courses. The student must have a valid TOEFL or IELTS certificate when applying.
3. Applicants for postgraduate studies do not require the GRE examination.
4. Upon completion of the required credit hours to be studied at OU, as specified in the Appendix, the student is granted a Bachelor's degree in the chosen discipline from PSUT after requesting a transcript from OU and submitting it to the Deanship of Admissions and Registration at PSUT.

Tuition fees:

1. The student shall pay the set tuition fees at PSUT.
2. The same tuition fees that are paid by American students from the State of Michigan (in-state) apply to PSUT students, and are payable to OU.
3. PSUT shall charge the student an annual fee of 750 JOD (seven hundred and fifty dinars) for each year spent by the student at UMD in lieu of admission and registration services, follow-up and course equivalency procedures.
4. The cost of participating in OU's health insurance plan is approximately \$ 2,000.
5. OU will help students to secure a place in university accommodation.
6. The student shall bear all other expenses such as accommodation, travel, and visa.

Note: There are no financial charges for enrolling at OU and the student pays no quarterly fees. The tuition fees mentioned above may be changed according to Oakland University regulations. They can be viewed through the following link: <https://www.oakland.edu>

Withdrawal from study at OU:

2. If the student commits any behavior that violates OU rules and regulations, he/she will be subject to the penalty of removal from the program. PSUT will assess the student's status to reach decision whether or not he/she should be permitted to continue studying at PSUT.

Regulations and Laws: Students studying at OU are obliged to abide by Michigan State Residency Laws and OU rules and regulations. Students are held fully responsible according to the law.

Entry visa to the USA: PSUT bears no responsibility for guaranteeing the student a visa to the United States. Visa requirements are as follows:

- An acceptance letter from Oakland University (PSUT will help the student to obtain it).
- Get an I-20, the form for international students, in order to obtain an F-1 visa.
- Follow the instructions to obtain a visa.

General information on joint programs run between PSUT and OU

1. Students who meet the requirements for admission to these programs are enrolled in the First Semester at OU (Fall Semester) or the following semester.
2. Students who meet the requirements should submit their application to PSUT's Deanship of Admissions and Registration no later than May 01, accompanied by the required documents such as transcripts and English proficiency test results. Students who complete these requirements in the Second Semester may apply and attach a list of the courses they are studying in that semester together with the other required documents.
3. Complete the forms required for admission to OU, obtained through the Deanship of Admissions and Registration.
4. The partial scholarship received by students who meet the conditions shall be equivalent to approximately 43% of the credit hour fees applied to overseas students at Oakland University.
5. Students wishing to apply for this program are subject to the Resolution taken by the Deans Council at PSUT, which stipulates the following:
 - a) The student who wishes to join a program run jointly with any of the partnering American universities will be charged a sum of JD 1000 upon application. This sum will be used as follows:
 - b) In case of the student being accepted, the entire sum shall be deducted from the amount all semester registration fees, according to the prevailing rules and regulations at the time. The remainder, if any, shall be accredited to the student's account.
 - c) The full amount will be returned to the student in case he/she is not accepted.
 - d) 500 JOD will be deducted if the student is accepted to the program but fails to enroll for any reason.

Three: ASAP program between PSUT and Oakland University (USA)

This is a joint program between Princess Sumaya University for Technology (PSUT) and Oakland University (OU). The program is open to all undergraduate, Master's and PhD students of all disciplines in PSUT's Schools of Business, Computing and Engineering. Undergraduate students study a minimum of 12 and a maximum of 16 credit hours during each semester spent at Oakland University, while graduate students take a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 credit hours. Students can enroll in the following months: from August to December, from Jan to Apr, or from May to Aug.

Admission Requirements:-

1. The student should be in the second year of his/her study program with a minimum average of 70%.
2. Undergraduate and graduate students must obtain an English proficiency certificate, with a score of (79) on the TOEFL exam or (6.5) on the IELTS exam.

Tuition fees and approximate cost of study at OU:-

1. The same tuition fees that are paid by American students from the State of Michigan (in-state) apply to PSUT students, and are payable to OU.
2. PSUT shall charge the student an annual fee of 750 JOD (seven hundred and fifty dinars) for each year spent by the student at UMD in lieu of admission and registration services, follow-up and course equivalency procedures.
3. The total fees to be paid by PSUT students for 12 credit hours in the undergraduate program, after discount, amount to approximately \$ 10,239.
4. The total fees to be paid by PSUT students for 12 credit hours in the Master's program, after discount, amount to approximately \$ 8,216.
5. The average cost of living per semester (including housing and food) is approximately \$ 5,100.
6. The cost of participating in OU's health insurance plan is approximately \$ 652.
7. OU will help students to secure a place in university accommodation.
8. The student is responsible for all other expenses such as accommodation, travel and visa.

Note: There are no financial charges for enrolling at OU and the student pays no quarterly fees.

Withdrawal from study at OU:-

1. A student who wishes to withdraw from his/her studies at OU for any reason may return to PSUT to complete his/her studies. The courses he/she studied at OU will be accredited to the study plan at PSUT.
